And the tears they [C] ran [C] [G] from her eyes of [C] blue [G] [F]

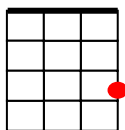
'Twas [F] early, [C] early [G] [F] all in the [C] morning [G] [F]

I hit the [C] road for [G] [F] old Done- [Dm] gal [F]

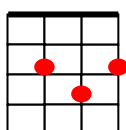
Said she: "Good- [C] bye sir", [G] [F] she cried and [C] kissed

shawl [G] [F]

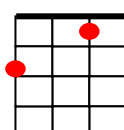
